

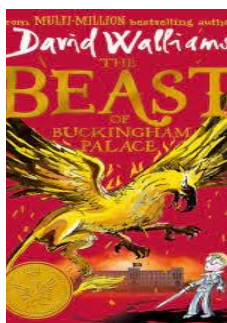

Ramadan is over but that doesn't mean we can't still show our appreciation by building a paper mosque.

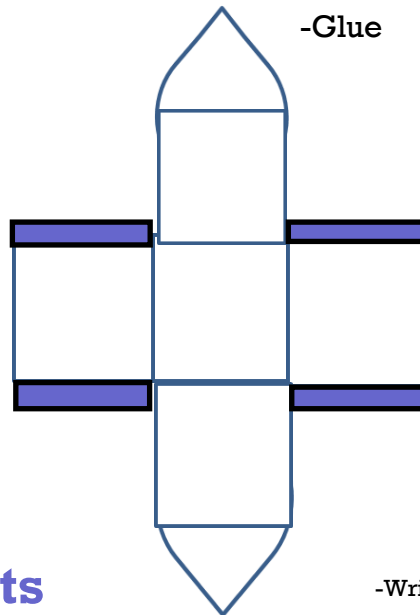
How to make:

- Stick the patterns you previously made onto the mosque's walls and decorate as you wish.



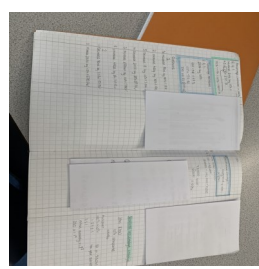
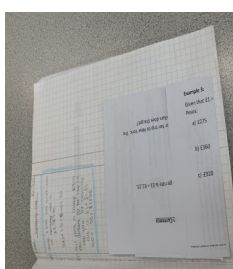
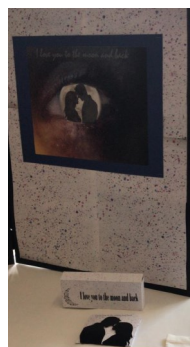
You will need:
