demonstrated impressive levels of teamwork and commitment and we are incredibly proud of them.

5) National Education Union Strike Days

Following an overwhelming rejection of the Government's offer, the NEU has announced further days on strike action on Thursday, 27th April and Tuesday, 2rd May.

So far, at our school Year 9 have missed three days of school, Year 8 and Year 10 have missed two days each, whilst Year 7 and Year 11 have attended school as normal (with a significant amount of cover lessons). Whilst we do not think it is at all sensible to lose Year 11 teaching time this close to exams, I have now decided that with every possibility of strike action rumbling on into the Autumn Term, that it is important to aim for some degree of equity in terms of days lost by each year group.

Therefore, on Thursday 27th April, we will have Year 11 and Year 9 in as normal, whilst the other three- year groups will be able access independent study resources via their TEAMs accounts. On Tuesday, 2nd May, we will have Year 11 and Year 10 in as normal. I will write in advance of each of these dates with more details, but wanted to give parents a heads-up as soon as I was able.
