Equipment



Each day pupils will need:

- Maths equipment calculator, protractor, ruler etc.
- Highlighters (useful for picking out key ideas / words in lessons) and coloured pens
- Planner
- Reading book
- PE kit (when necessary)

School canteen



We have a school canteen where pupils can choose what they would like to eat from a range of choices.

Pupils can sit and eat their food in the canteen or take it away to eat in outside in when it is warm. Pupils should not be in classrooms or the corridors.

Food is paid for by a fingerprint system, accounts are topped up from home by Parentmail.

Students who have free school meals will have credit put on their account automatically every day.



Behaviour expectations



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- Come to school with a **positive** attitude, if you have a problem ask for help.
- Ensure you are on time and in correct uniform.
- Be kind to peers and respect people's differences
- Be respectful and polite to staff at all times.
- Listen carefully to instructions, don't talk whilst the teacher is talking.
- Try your hardest at all times. Stay on task in lessons and ask if you are unsure.
- No mobile phones
- Move sensibly and quietly around school being aware of others around you.
- Use polite language at all times.

If you choose not to make the right choices about your behaviour in lessons you can expect:

- 2 warnings
- Detention
- Sent to Time Out so the rest of the class can continue their learning

Attendance and punctuality



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Good attendance is one of the most important building blocks for a successful school career. It is difficult to progress academically if you do not have continuity of development.

At King Edward VI Northfield School for Girls we place a great emphasis on <u>regular attendance</u> and pupils are rewarded with certificates and prizes if they achieve attendance targets.

How can you support with attendance and punctuality?



- Schedule appointments out of school hours.
- Ensuring that your child wakes up in plenty of time to be ready and prepared for school.
- Inform us as soon as possible if your daughter is seriously unwell and unable to attend that day.
- Help to ensure that their bag and equipment is organised the night before so that this does not delay departure in the morning.
- Discussing any issues of lateness to ensure this does not become a habit.
- Monitoring your child's attendance and look for patterns of lateness.
- Contact us if you are aware of any reason why your daughter may not want to attend school.

Uniform



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- Black blazer with school badge
- White shirt and school tie
- Black knee length skirt or school trousers
- Sensible flat black shoes
- Plain white or black socks or plain black or natural tights
- Black plain headscarf/hijab permitted only for religious reasons. Headbands should be plain and black, bandanas are not permitted in school.
- Jewellery should not be worn in school apart from a watch and one stud earring in each ear. Strictly no other piercings are allowed.
- Noticeable make up is not permitted in school.



PE kit



- Black polo top with school badge and pupil's initials.
- Black leggings, joggers or shorts with pupil's initials
- These are compulsory items -PE kit must be worn to every PE lesson
- Optional: Black hoodie with school badge and pupil's initials – other hoodies are not allowed.





Homework

If a student completes an hour's homework per school night for five years, it is the equivalent of an extra school year.



Why is homework important?

- It can provide students with the opportunity to:
 - > practise further what has been learnt in class.
 - > apply what they have learnt in new contexts or situations.
 - > prepare them for future learning.
 - integrate skills with knowledge and concepts.
- It can allow students to develop the practice of independent learning.
- It gives the most enthusiastic students the opportunity to apply their passion and gain a deeper insight into the subject.
- It can allow students to use materials and other sources of information that are not always available in the classroom.
- It can involve parents and others in students' work for their mutual benefit.
- It can form an important part of the student's notes.
- It gives students valuable experience of working to deadlines.



Homework Priorities

- I. A staged approach to support the building of routines and habits.
- 2. Revision of core knowledge to be a priority.
- 3. The development of a variety of revision strategies from Year 7 to Year 11, rather than being a focus only at KS4.
- 4. Transition support:
 - Year 6 to 7
 - Year 8 to 9

Mission for this year

- I. To reduce the number of students not completing homework.
- 2. To ensure that all students know why homework is important so that they see the benefit to them.
- 3. To ensure that the teaching of retrieval practice is taught using form time and lessons so that students know how to quiz and are successful.
- 4. To instill good routines and habits.
- 5. To explicitly link homework and revision.

A Staged Approach-Year 7

Year 7 – 10-15 minutes of homework for each subject from Spring 1 onwards

Autumn 1 (no detentions sat for non-completion but sanctions are recorded on Arbor)

- Daily reading, including quizzing via Accelerated Reader (monitored via a reading log by class teacher throughout the Autumn term)
- Weekly Mathswatch homework

Autumn 2 (no detentions sat for non-completion but sanctions are recorded on Arbor)

- Daily reading, including quizzing via Accelerated Reader
- Weekly Mathswatch homework
- Quizzing on keywords, definitions, key knowledge in French and Science only
 - Students to be tested on their quizzing homework through the Do Now quiz and knowledge quizzes.

<u>Spring 1 onwards (detentions sat for non completion of Maths, French and Science - other subjects to record on Arbor)</u>

- Daily reading, including quizzing via Accelerated Reader
- Weekly Mathswatch homework
- Quizzing on keywords, definitions, key knowledge in all subjects
- Students to be tested on their quizzing homework through the Do Now quiz and knowledge quizzes.

Detentions sat from Spring 2 onwards for non completion of homework for all subjects

School trips

Our trips policy ensures that all pupils have the opportunity to go on trips. All pupils in each year group will have 2 trip days during the academic year. This ensures that no pupil misses out on enrichment opportunities.

Over the 5 years they spend with us pupils will experience a range of trips to broaden their cultural experience and underpin their learning in school. These trips will be fully funded by King Edward VI Northfield School for Girls to ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities.

In addition to these core educational visits, our young people can enjoy a range of additional trips and opportunities from residential visits to college and university taster days.



Medicines

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If medication is needed during the school day, it can be brought into Reception.

However we can only accept and administer medicines that have been prescribed.


The medicines should always be provided in their original container which details the name of the child and the dosage requirements.

The parent/carer is responsible for delivering the medication to school where a 'Medicines I' form will need to be completed.

Inhalers and Epipens should be carried on the student <u>and</u> a spare kept in the office.

Water bottles

- Please ensure you bring a water bottle into school with you.
- Pupils are allowed to drink water throughout lessons and in exams.
 Water fountains have been installed throughout the school.
- Fizzy and caffeine filled drinks dehydrate the brain. Energy drinks are not allowed in school.




How can you support your daughter?



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- Engage in your daughter's learning check ePraise regularly
- Support homework to be done, where possible, on the night set
- Provide a quiet place to study with no gadgets while doing homework
- Encourage breakfast and healthy snacks as this supports concentration and behaviour
- Support your daughter to get enough sleep
- Encourage your daughter to attend extra curricular clubs in and outside of school – fun and relaxation is also important!
