1) Staffing Change

After what will be nine years as Headteacher and over eight as Deputy Headteacher, I have taken the difficult decision to step down in the summer to pursue new challenges and hopefully find a better work-life balance. I have been deeply fortunate to be Headteacher of such a wonderful small school and throughout that time I have done my best to support our brilliant pupils and I have found this to be a hugely rewarding job. I deeply appreciate all the support I have received from pupils, parents and staff throughout this time.
